

The New Hampshire Arabian Horse Association One Day Arabian Show and Summer Jubilee Horse Show will be taking the following precautions and steps to ensure the health and safety of all involved with our horse show:

General:

- Follow CDC, federal, state, and local guidelines.
- Hold a Manager's Staff Meeting prior to start of the show to discuss issues, protocol and procedures that will be in place during the show
- Hold a Manager's Meeting Thursday afternoon (subject to change) with Trainers or a representative from each barn prior to start of the show to discuss issues, protocol and procedures that will be in place during the show
- Enforce social distancing throughout show grounds
- Enforce wearing of masks when unable to socially distance
- Provide sanitizing stations throughout show grounds and in center ring
- Provide hand sanitizer to all officials, ring crew, office staff and maintenance staff
- Provide masks to barn staff and other official personnel
- Routinely sanitize restrooms throughout the day by show staff/facilities staff. Hand sanitizer, soap and cleaning supplies will be readily available in the restrooms
- Encourage all in attendance to routinely wash hands

Office and Entries:

- Establish appointment times for check in and check out
- Design the office to provide proper social distancing guidelines and the use of masks while in the office.

Show and warm-up areas:

- Enforce limit of two people per horse in warm up area
- Use an In-gate and Out-gate to avoid congestion and allow social distancing while entering and exiting the show ring.
- Set social distance spacing markers along the rail
- Create separate sections for each barn in the bleachers. This will be based on sponsorship and stabling proximity
- Create a method to present ribbons and trophies that has less hand to hand contact

Stabling:

- Configure stabling to allow for social distancing

- Enforce social distancing when practical while working on horses inside the barn

Entrance to show grounds:

- All exhibitors, trainers, grooms and family members will sign the Waiver developed by the New England Horsemen's Council and the COVID-19 Questionnaire.
- Management will have a person at the entrance gate of the horse show grounds to check in ensure all entering have signed the waivers. Each person will receive a bracelet acknowledging signature and this bracelet must be worn for the duration of the show.

Vendors:

- Any vendor must be COVID-19 trained per NH Guidelines and must practice and set up their booths to ensure social distancing recommendations

Spectators:

- Outside spectators will not be allowed on the grounds. Only those associated with the horse show will be allowed entrance on the grounds.

WE UNDERSTAND THAT WEARING OF MASKS WHILE AT THE HORSE SHOW CAN SOMETIMES BE UNCOMFORATBLE OR INCONVENIENT, BUT PLEASE REMEMBER WE ARE FOLLOWING THESE GUIDELINES FOR OUR INDUSTRY.
